What happens when data collection takes place outside the UK/Europe?

Obtaining Informed Consent

Home institution:

- Principle
- Practice
- Rationale

Fieldwork experience:

- Participants became hesitant
- Irritation
- Signing a consent form is not considered a protection mechanism

Context Cultures

(Hall 1976, Copeland and Griggs 1986)

German German Swiss Scandinavian

American English Canadian

French Spanish Italian

Mexican Greek Arab

Japanese Chinese

El Salvador

Lower Context

Low Context

Communication:

- Specific
- Detailed
- Precise

Poorer at decoding:

- Unspoken message
- Body language

Higher Context

High Context

Communication:

- Less direct
- Emphasis on:
- Human relations

More sensitivity to:

- Non-verbals
- Feelings of others

Communication in High and Low Context Cultures (II)

Low context (UK)

Rule-based (Hooker 2003)

- Rules work because they are spelled out
- Signing a consent form can function as a protection mechanism

High context (El Salvador)

Relationship-based

- Sharing information is more successful within a personal relationship
- Asking for signed consent ignores the rules of communication

Conclusion

Developing Culturally Sensitive Research Ethics

- Ethics committees need to revise standards towards a better inclusion of other cultures
- Inquire research practices of academic institutions of the fieldwork culture
- Intercultural training for researchers and ethics committees
